History 119 / THE MAKING OF MODERN EUROPE, 1500-1815 Mr. Sella

Textbook: CHAMBERS, The Western Experience, Vol. 2: The Early Modern Period

Required Readings: MOSSE, The Reformation  
LEFEBVRE, The Coming of the French Revolution  
LANGFORD, Galileo, Science and the Church

The course will involve three lectures and one discussion section a week. Attendance at both lectures and discussion sections is expected of all students.

Students not present in their regular section by the third week of classes will be presumed to have dropped the course.

The course is offered for either 3 or 4 credits. Students who elect to take the course for 4 rather than 3 credits will be required to write a 13-14 page (about 4000 words) report on a book chosen in consultation with the professor not later than March 1 and due by May 1. Late reports will be penalized at the rate of 2 points per day after due date. Under no circumstances will a 4-credit student receive a grade of incomplete for failure to submit his/her report before the end of the semester.

EXAMS: There will be two one-hour exams and one two-hour final for all students.

GRADES: Final grades in the course will be determined as follows:

Students are expected to master the content of the textbook and other required reading material according to the attached schedule. They are also urged to read the relevant chapters or books before a given topic is covered in lectures.
