COURSE DESCRIPTION

An examination of a single phenomenon in modern African history: the impact of European colonialism on sub-Saharan Africa. Special stress will be laid on the political response, in particular the rise of modern nationalism. The approach is analytical and comparative.

LECTURES

Seminar format. Occasional lecture, perhaps once or twice a month.

WRITTEN ASSIGNMENTS and EXAMINATIONS

Regular short written and oral reports on selected topics are the heart of the course.

GRADING SYSTEM

Grades will be awarded on class participation and individual reports.

REQUIRED READINGS

Considerable reading in secondary and, occasionally, primary sources.
